



Mark Wheeler -Full time Regional Talent Operation Lead.

 The role is primarily responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the overall program and to create an environment that will enable the most talented young footballers (male & female) in the region to meet their football potential. A high focus is community relationships with all partners, local leagues & clubs plus provide opportunities for volunteers/staff to reach a higher level.

Tia Pastore- Full time Admin & Operations Coordinator (37.5 hours)

• The role is primarily responsible for supporting the Regional Talent Operations Lead and the Coach with the operational and logistical elements on match day and training nights.

This position supports the male & female programs.



FIND A PLAYER WHO CAN PLAY IN A VARIETY OF POSITIONS:


- IT TAKES ALL SHAPES TO PLAY THE GAME
- AIM NOT TO PIGEONHOLE A PLAYER TO ONE POSITION
- NEED TO GIVE TALLER & UNDER DEVLOPED PLAYERS MORE TIME TO DEVELOP

AS PRESSURE INCREASES, WE FIND OUT WHO'S WHO IN THE TEAM

SPEED, KICKING ABILITY, COMPETITIVE ARE ALL MUST HAVE'S...

RATE THEM BY 4 FACTORS:

- Win own ball (smart, competitive, football nous etc)
- Handle ball cleanly
- Deliver's ball to teammate hand/foot efficiently
- Have the fitness levels required for higher level (A to D) GPS Data
- THEN IDENTIFY -WHAT'S THEIR TRICK?
- **RE- CHECK PREVIOUS YEARS TALENT ID-** Follow up players, work out those you thought were at the level and work out why they didn't make it!
- **DEVELOPMENT RATE- BASELINE TESTING**, Sport & Loading Survey's, plus continual heights & Other strength and fitness measurements every 6 months.
- **OTHER SPORTS-** Over use factors!


- <u>Body Size</u> Room for improvement or have they reached their peak?
- Sufficient speed for AFL my rule of thumb: "can't buy speed, but 99% of the time you can build endurance."
- Tall Key Position Player- Male/ Female
 - 1. Coates Talent League Ruckman is expected to be 199-202cm/185-188cm
 - 2. Key Position Forward 195-198cm/182-185cm
 - 3. Key defender 195-198cm/ 182-185cm with competitive edge and speed
- Midfield players: multiple position, speed, competitive, vary in size but we have seen a shift in the past 5-10 years that more in Male program are 188-193cm.
- Coates Talent League Under 18 = 2-year list management adding your 3rd year with the current under 16-17 crop....constantly reviewing/adding
- Football Nous- listen at the huddles are they coachable?
- Family interaction- positive or negative?
- Recruiting List- We always Compare to others who we rate in that position/size in our program: For example what position will she/he play in the future at a higher level. Can it be multiple. What's their trick? Reason we rate against other POTENTIAL players (too many of same type and shape- play 13-15 Coates Talent League Games a year



Coates Talent League Dragon's Girls

- 1. Recruiting starts in Girl's 15th Year
- 2. We Start when Girls play Round 1 SMJFL
- 3. Closer look Interleague Carnival (15's)
- 4. July-September Dragons/St Kilda NGA Training & Selection Games
- 5. November 2022 List announcement 2023 NAB League Girls Under 16-19 Pre-season Squad...Train 2 nights a week December to late January
- 6. End February 2023 announce final 2023 Playing list (55-60) which is a mixture of 16–19-year-old Girls....Train 2 nights a week, plus 1 recovery night until Season concludes.
- 7. COATES Talent League Season Starts- Girls play with us or Local/school football if not selected.
- 8. Local recruiting continues- Girls can be added at anytime.
- 9. Vic Metro selections, All Australian & COATES Talent League AFLW Draft (Date TBC)
- 10. 2023 SMJFL Interleague & Local recruiting- players added for stage 2 (July-September 2023)
- 11. Announce 2023 Pre –season list (practice game)
- 12. End of season player exit interviews, IDP programs, medical screenings, pathway transition VFLW



Coates Talent League Dragon's U16 Boys

- 1. Recruiting starts in Boy's 15th Year
- 2. Closer look Interleague Carnival

3. July-September Dragons/St Kilda NGA Training & Selection Games...Boys chosen from Interleague and by our recruiting network...a lot of players added in this stage due to selection limitations/APS sport.

4. November 2022 List announcement 2023 NAB Futures Pre-season Squad (50)...Train 2 nights a week December to late March

5. End February/March squad trimmed back to 30 for Metro Region Challenge Championships

6. Vic Metro Selection- all remaining players to play SMJFL or School football

7. Local recruiting started round 1 SMJFL- players to be added for Stage 2 Futures (end July 2023).

8. Stage 2 Futures- 2 nights a week (one night recovery, 1 skills)

9. September Squad selection Games against another COATES Talent League Region...players from these games will make up the Under 17 Dragons 2024.

10. All remining players back to local football and will remaining on recruiters watch list for following season at local and school football



Coates Talent League Dragon's Under 18 Boys

1. 3-year list strategy process has a pre-season squad start in November 2022.

2. November 2022 List announcement 2023 Coates Talent League Pre-season Squad (80)...Train 2-3 nights a week December to start March

3.March 2023 Coates Talent League Squad (55-60)

4. Rounds 1-4 COATES Talent League Games to help Vic Metro Selection. (3 nights a week training)

5. Rounds 5-13 COATES Talent League Continues- those non selected to play SMJFL/SFNL/VAFA or School football

- 7. Local recruiting started round 1 all leagues plus school football- players can be added anytime
- 8. Second half of the COATES Talent League season is usually when 17- and 16-year-old players get games.
- 9. Vic Metro selections, All Australian & COATES Talent League AFLW Draft (Date TBC)

10. September Squad selection Games against another NAB League Region...players from these games will make up the Under 18 Dragons 2024 and will be 17-year- old's or players identified from local recruiting.

11. All remining players back to local football and will remaining on recruiters watch list for following season at local and school football

12. End of season player exit interviews, IDP programs, medical screenings, pathway transition VFL





2023 TALENT LEAGUE LIST MANAGEMENT - GUIDING PRINCIPLES

1) List Management to be a partnership between Talent Pathways Coach & Talent Operations Lead with support of STATE MANAGER

2) Collaborative approach to List Management working with broader industry stakeholders such as Local Coaches, AFL Talent Team, AFL Recruiters and State Academy Staff

3) Focus to be on developing & showcasing talent for both the 2023 & 2024 National Drafts.

4) Talent League BOYS list size ~ 35 -40

2023 Mid Season Draft 19 Years (2004 born)

Returning players have clearly demonstrated AFL attributes and realistic draft chances throughout 2023.

Continue to prioritise developing key position players for the AFL industry (195cm+)

Developing players coming off a long-term injury who have played less than 5 pathway games may be considered.

Ongoing support of Indigenous & Multi-Cultural through squad training & game opportunities

VFL Pre-Season training/games to be prioritized and encouraged.

All returning players to be set up for clear transition plan following mid-season draft (June 2023)

5-8 % of List - (Up to 3 Per Match)

2023 National Draft 18 Years (2005 born)

Players eligible for their first draft year who generally warrant selection in the best side in the early rounds of the season.

Selection of players who may be considered for National Championships.

Ongoing support of Indigenous & Multi-Cultural through squad training & game opportunities.

A clear focus on the individual development of players throughout season.

Continue to prioritise developing key position players for the AFL industry (195cm+)

Opportunity to add players to list after demonstrating outstanding form at local level.

45-55 % of Playing List

2024 National Draft 17 Years (2006 born)

Full integration into the Under 18 Talent Program for players eligible for the 2024 draft.

Enhanced development program (training & games) for this group to fast track their development.

Ongoing support of Indigenous & Multi-Cultural through squad training & game opportunities.

A clear focus on individual development of players throughout season.

Continue to monitor local/school football and other sports in order identify talent for emerging talent.

Continue to prioritise developing key position players for the industry (195cm+)

30-40 % of Playing List









we all see things slightly differently when analysing Talent. <u>It's an opinion game</u>, so be prepared to be put your case forward and be challenged...sometimes, being knocked back is the challenge <u>SOME</u> players need to work harder.

As a club we need you to help identify talented players across the Region. You know your players best, we don't always get the Talent ID right and is why we constantly review, cross check and revisit recruiting lists and watch games...we just need the right players identified to play Interleague and played in a variety of positions through their Junior pathway.








SOUTHERN FNL

- The SFNL also has a 'Thirds' Men's football competition for all ages and is suited for players developing their skills or who are time poor and cannot commit to regular training throughout the week.




